LA TREASURER FLEMING APPLAUDS NET ZERO DEPARTURES:

Baton Rouge, LA: Louisiana State Treasurer John Fleming, M.D., applauds the recent decisions by Morgan Stanley, Bank of America, and Wells Fargo to leave the Net Zero Banking Alliance, a United Nations-backed coalition of banks dedicated to advancing global net zero climate goals through their financing activities. They joined Goldman Sachs and Citigroup, which previously withdrew from the Net Zero Banking Alliance.

STATE FINANCIAL OFFICERS LEAD EFFORT SEEKING "DAY ONE" ACTION FROM CONGRESS ON NATIONAL DEBT:

Baton Rouge, LA: Louisiana State Treasurer John Fleming, M.D., joined 37 state financial officers in sending a letter to each member of Congress imploring them to develop and implement a long-term plan to remedy the nation's severe financial problems. They are leading an effort to sound the alarm on the severity of the crisis and offer support to Congress in the difficult decisions ahead.

"One of the main reasons for our dire financial situation is the reckless spending of our federal government. Congress must address this situation immediately before the crisis worsens," said Dr. Fleming.

On Thursday January 9, LA State Treasurer John Fleming, M.D., had the pleasure of addressing the West Calcasieu Chamber of Commerce. He discussed many topics including the Louisiana School Transparency Project that requires school governing authorities to provide specific financial information to the Louisiana Department of Treasury. The project will increase financial transparency in Louisiana K-12 public and charter school systems and will allow citizens to compare school budgets in traditional public schools and public charter schools. The information will be available on the School Transparency Project Portal, located on the Louisiana Department of Treasury website



On January 13, LA State Treasurer John Fleming, M.D., had the pleasure of speaking to the Kiwanis Club of Houma. Among the topics he discussed was the important work of the State Bond Commission, which receives applications from parishes, municipalities, special taxing districts, and other political subdivisions of the State requesting authority to incur debt or levy taxes. These applications are reviewed for compliance with Constitutional and statutory requirements and feasibility, including the ability to repay any indebtedness incurred.








LA STATE TREASURER JOHN FLEMING ENCOURAGES EVERYONE TO CHECK FOR THEIR UNCLAIMED PROPERTY:

Dr. Fleming recommends all Louisiana residents visit LaCashClaim.org and search the website to find out if you have unclaimed property. According to Dr. Fleming, "One in six individuals in Louisiana has unclaimed property, with claims averaging \$900. It is your money; we want you to claim it." There is currently \$1.2 billion in unclaimed property to return to Louisiana citizens.
